Tennessee Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc. SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION POLICIES, 2021-2022

- 1. These scholarships are available for college juniors, seniors and graduate students. No Doctoral candidates may apply. Sophomores may make application for the junior year.
- 2. Applicant must be a resident of Tennessee and attending a Tennessee school.
- 3. TFGC is proud of its scholarship program which offers financial aid to students and promotes study in Agriculture Education, Horticulture (inc. Fruit Science/Environmental/Communications), Floriculture, Landscape Design, Botany, Plant Pathology/Science, Forestry, Agronomy, Environmental Concerns (Management: Environmental, Horticulture Resource/Environmental Behavior, etc.), Economics, Environmental Conservation (inc. Engineering, Law, etc.), City (Rural And Urban) Planning, Wildlife Science, Habitat or Forest/Systems Ecology, Land Management and/or related or allied subjects. Applicants must be **majoring** in one of these fields of study. The TFGC Scholarship Committee must grant approval for application to be made in any major other than the ones listed.
- 4. Applicant must be a full time, currently enrolled student at the school through which the application is being made.
- 5. Applications must be mailed to the TFGC Scholarship Chairman as a **complete package prior to February 15**. No application received after that date will be considered.
- 6. The TFGC Scholarship Chairman will submit applicants or number of scholarships to be awarded, to the TFGC Board for approval at the Winter Board Meeting.
- 7. The TFGC Scholarships will be in the amount of \$1,500 each, limited to a total of \$4,500 in any fiscal year, if funds are available.
- 8. All applicants must have at least a "B" average in order to apply. (3.0 on a 4.0 point scale).
- 9. A complete official academic transcript, which included the latest grading period must be furnished.

The following Scale of Points will be used for the evaluation of each application:

ACADEMIC RECORD: Complete official transcript of grades is required.

Emphasis is placed on the strength of courses

related to student's major in required field.

APPLICANT'S LETTER: Discussion of background, goals, personal

(25% of total) commitment to chosen career, financial need.
